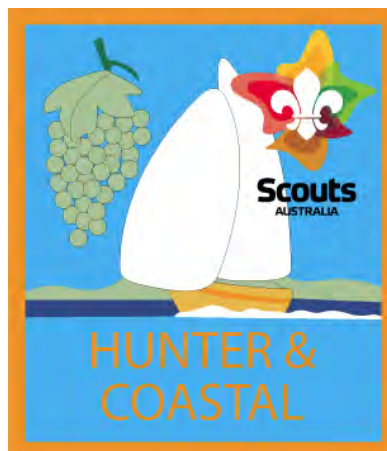
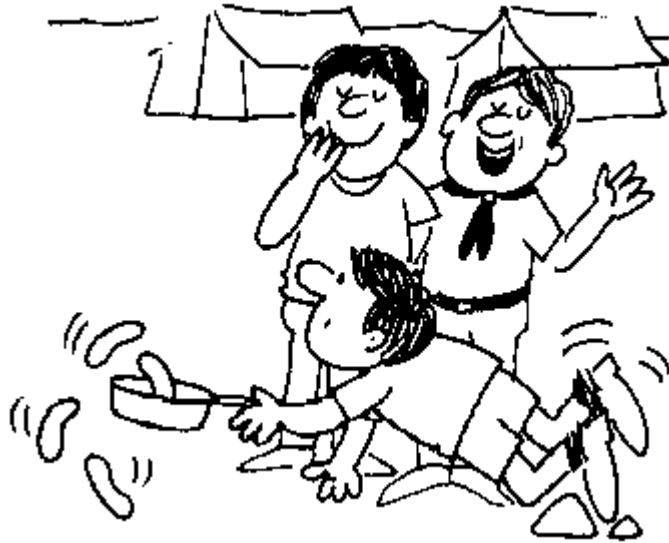

Sleeping Bag & pillow.

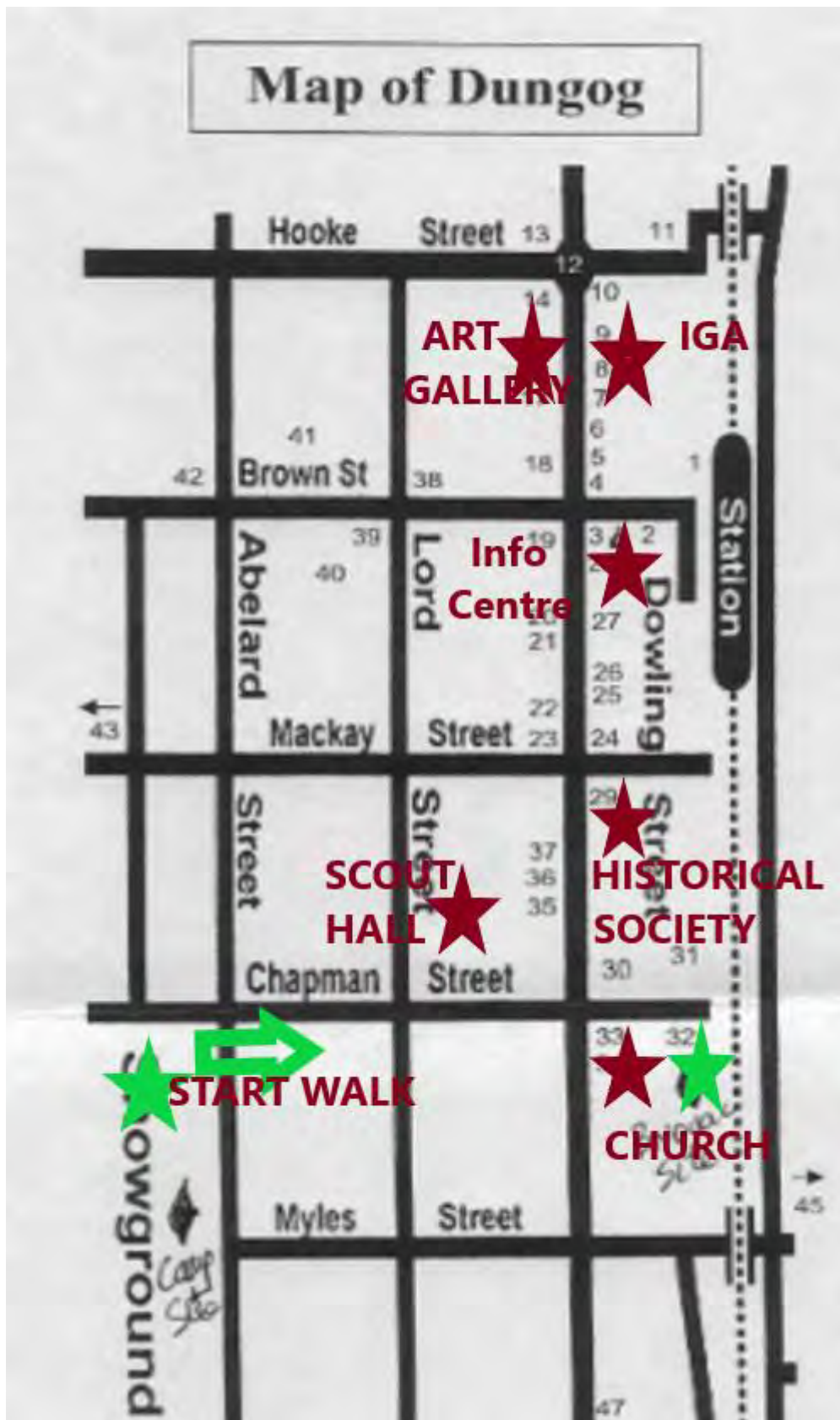
Small Tarp/Fly or Plastic Sheet, 2 sml poles, four pegs and rope – to make a hootche.

Patrols will walk from the showground into Dungog to look at the town. The First Base is at Historical Society, Art Gallery, Church, & Scout Hall Venturer Base (Scout Lane).

House Keeping Rules

1. All cars and trailers are to be parked in the car park, with the exception of specialised cooking trailers. Speed limit of 10km/ hr any where on site.
2. Scouts, bedded down and lights out 10:30pm
3. No generators in troop lines.
4. If some thing needs cleaning or repairing, then clean it up, pick it up or get help. All leaders are expected to do their bit to ensure the Scouts have a great time, someone else is only going to have do it if you don't.
5. Troop gateways MUST have a hand wash basin with a cap of disinfectant. This must be regularly changed at each meal time, or when looking gross.
6. Please do not yell or bellow at Scouts, no one enjoys hearing leaders loose it.
7. Please have daily Patrol Leader meetings/debriefs,(after Supper?) make it a little special, lollies etc. check on how their day went, congratulate them on a great job.
8. PLEASE ENSURE appropriate dress at all times, no low cut tops or shortie pants. Swimming- no budgie smugglers. Be sun smart .
9. Please ensure all Leaders and Scouts wear covered footwear at ALL times.
10. Limit showers to 3 minutes.

Troop Leaders are responsible for making a leader roster for their bases, ensuring they all get a break, and an afternoon/ morning off to explore the other sub camps and activities.

I really appreciate the effort required to put together a great camp for your troop. I look forward to your assistance with these few rules, and enjoy receiving feedback.
